Elders Quorum (EQ) and Relief Society (RS) Presidency Members:

Handbook, Section 21 – "Elders quorum and Relief Society presidencies help ministering brothers and sisters learn how to minister to others. They also give inspiration, guidance, and support."

- Discuss ward ministering needs and plans in regular presidency, ward council, and youth council meetings.
- Prayerfully consider ministering assignments, review with bishop, and extend assignments. Frequent review those individuals (including youth) and households not yet assigned.
- Meet <u>quarterly</u> with each ministering brother or sister and their companion preferably held in person and with both members of the companionship.
- EQ and RS presidencies meet at least <u>quarterly</u> together to review what they have learned in ministering interviews and to coordinate ministering assignments. The assigned high councilor is encouraged to attend.
- EQ and RS presidents meet at least <u>quarterly</u> with the bishop to discuss the needs of ward members and possible changes in ministering assignments. The RS president meets with the bishop <u>monthly</u>. The EQ president meets with the bishop <u>regularly</u>.

Every Elder, RS Sister, and 14+ Age Youth:

Handbook, Section 21 – "Ministering brothers and sisters are not called, sustained, or set apart. Their service is **part of the covenant** they made at baptism (see Mosiah 18:8–11)."

Bishops and other ward leaders teach all ward members to:

- Meet <u>quarterly</u> with a member of the EQ or RS presidency please make this easy for your presidency members!
- Minister to each assigned family consistent, personal visits <u>plus</u> other means of contact and acts of service (D&C 20:47, 53)
- Minister with your assigned companion including youth companions.
- Encourage personal visits and contacts from your own ministering brothers and sisters please make it easy to be visited and ministered to!
